ORDER REVOKING DISPENSING PRIVILEGES

INTRODUCTION

On November 4, 2002 the Arizona Medical Board ("Board") was informed by the Drug Enforcement Administration ("DEA") that the DEA had revoked the Certificate of Registration of Jeri Hassman, M.D. ("Respondent"). Accordingly, the Board, through its Executive Director, enters the following Order. A.R.S. § 32-1405(C)(28). Any violation of this Order constitutes unprofessional conduct pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-1401(24)(r), and may result in disciplinary action pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-1451.

INTERIM ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that:

- Respondent's registration to dispense a controlled substance, prescriptiononly drug, or prescription-only device is revoked based on Respondent's loss of her DEA Certificate of Registration.
- 2. Because Respondent no longer possesses a DEA Certificate of Registration she may no longer prescribe or dispense controlled substances. However, Respondent may continue to see patients. In order to ensure continuity of care for her patients, including their continuing to receive necessary medications, Respondent shall enter into an agreement with another physician to prescribe or dispense any controlled substances required by her patients or shall otherwise ensure continuity of care for her patients.
